In this article, the authors put forward a new set of standards with equity at the core so as to advance the conversation about why standards centered on equity are needed as well as what implications would follow from having equity-focused standards. To this end, 10 high-leverage equitable leadership practices are proposed, which have been identified through research and the extant literature as those most likely to mitigate disparities for students who have not been well served due to their race, class, ethnicity, home language and/or ability.

The authors discuss how a set of equity-focused leadership standards would facilitate radical changes in leadership preparation programs, professional development and evaluation. It is hoped that this work will augment the conversation around leadership standards and compel action to bring equity to the center.

This narrative inquiry seeks to advance the field of educational leadership preparation by exploring ways to interrupt personal, interpersonal and institutional racism through the senses-ways in which people perceive their experiences and relation to others. Findings suggest that participants engage in actions aligned with revelations from their reflective process and utilize their positions as a means to address racism at various levels within educational systems.
